COVID-19


-  Following new federal guidelines that were announced on the 17th December, the hotel only allows access to guests (aged 16 and over) with a Swiss (or European) Covid certificate that either proves recent recovery from covid-19 or an EU-approved vaccination (as per the Swiss so-called “2G regulation”). For children 15 years old or younger, the hotel requires either a negative PCR test (not older than 72h) or a negative rapid antigen test result (not older than 24 h) upon check-in.


-  Guests with a Swiss (or European) Covid certificate entering Switzerland from abroad will additionally have to present either a negative PCR test (not older than 72h) or a negative rapid antigen test result (not older than 24 h) upon check-in. The hotel will need to validate the guest's test results upon check-in. Please [click here](#) to see the decree of the Swiss Government.

-  The Swiss (or European) Covid certificate QR code is scanned every time a guest enters the property. International certificates will need to be converted before check-in using the request form that you can [access here](#).

Please note that it can take up to five days for your request to be processed.

-  Access to our restaurants will also only be granted to guests with a Covid certificate that either proves recent recovery from covid-19 or an EU-approved vaccination.

-  Our Palace Wellness, Fitness Center, Renaissance bar and King's Social House can only allow entry to recovered or vaccinated guests with a negative Covid test result or guests who have recovered or have been vaccinated in the last 4 months.

-  Guests are required to wear a mask within the hotel premises, unless seated and with the exception of our Renaissance bar and King's Social House.

-  The staff at Badrutt's Palace will be wearing their masks at all times, including outdoors.
